1. WJEC5 and AGM EJTA Paris

From 9 to 11 July 2019 the <u>5th World Journalism Education Congress</u> will be held at the Dauphine University in Paris. Registration will be open soon.

On Monday 8th July EJTA will have a short but important Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the Dauphine University, from 15.30 to 17.30 h.

2. Teachers' Conference Thessaloniki 2018

The EJTA Teachers' Conference 2018 in Thessaloniki (18/19 October) has been a success. Over 100 participants listened to the many interesting presentations on Crisis Reporting and/or joined one of the hands-on sessions. The social tour, the dinner on Thursday and the venue were wonderful. Andreas Veglis and Nikos Panagiotou and their team even arranged beautiful weather. We thank the Aristotle University team for their excellent work!

3. Roles, Values, Qualifications

The EJTA Research on "Journalistic Roles, Values and Qualifications in the **21st century; how journalism educators view the future of a profession in transition**" is well under way. The data that were collected in the first part of 2018 are now being analyzed. There was a first presentation on some of the outcomes during the AGM in Barcelona; other presentations were done at the conferences of IAMCR in Oregon and ECREA in Lugano. At the World Journalism Education Congress in Paris (July 2019) the final research report will be presented.

4. EUfactcheck

The project is running full speed now with 20 EJTA schools being a participant and with a clear aim of continuing to be a pedagogical project during which journalism students will be checking political statements. EUFACTCHECK is the fact-checking project of the European Journalism Training Association (EJTA) that intends to build a sustainable curriculum unit on fact checking within a European network of Journalism schools. We will publish fact checks and blog posts to test our common methodology

during the European elections. The project gathers fact checks from more than 150 students and staff from more

than 20 EJTA schools. Through fact checking European political claims and trying to tackle misinformation, we want our students and our public to grow a deeper insight and interest in democratic processes, both on national and European level. EUFACTCHECK wishes to motivate fact-based debate in the EU and to stimulate Participating EJTA Schools



The next important step is the Bootcamp in Utrecht on 24-25 January 2019 when all staff (40 coaches) will be thoroughly prepared to start factchecking with their students in the context of the European Parliamentary Elections.

The results of this project will be presented at the World Journalism Education Conference in Paris and in autumn 2019 a manual for journalism students will be published, which will highlight the use of the unique flowchart for factchecking that has been developed specifically for this project.

5. Other Projects

EJTA will participate in an Erasmus-project called DESTIN (Developing Standards, Integrity and Professionalism). The project's main aim is to improve the quality of journalism education in Ukrain by reforming the curricula for 9 BA and 11 MA Journalism programmes (2 degrees in each of the 10 Ukrainian

partner universities), so that all new/revised programmes are aligned with European Qualifications Frameworks (EQF), and sustainable connections with European journalism departments and associations can be developped.

6. FEJS

The next conference of the Forum for European Journalism Students will take place in Antwerp (Annual Conference, 28 March till 2 April 2019). 7. Mobility Catalogue

The EJTA Secretariat has tried to update the information/weblinks that are in the <u>New Mobility Catalogue</u>. Before the end of 2018 all members need to check if the information about their international programmes is still updated. A double check will be organised during our next AGM, in Paris.

8. Election (vice-)president

A <u>letter</u> about the vacancy of (vice-)president was sent to all EJTA members in October. If you wish to apply, you need to do that before the end of 2018.

9. Invoices 2019

The invoices for the EJTA fee of 2019 will be sent to all members in December 2018. Deadline for payment is March 15th 2019.

10. Formal seat of EJTA

For many years the official seat of EJTA has been at the European Journalism Centre in Maastricht. Earlier this year EJC decided to end its membership, because they will no longer be active in education. To avoid complex juridical issues we needed a Dutch member to take over the official EJTA seat. Our colleagues in Utrecht were willing to take over.
