With this Newsletter that drops in your mailbox at the same moment we planned the EJTA AGM 2020 in Vienna, we hope to hearten all our EJTA friends and colleagues and try to provide you with some news and information about our association.

1. AGM 2020

For obvious reasons the AGM 2020 in May in Vienna had to be postponed. Our Austrian colleagues have informed us that it will not be possible for them to organise a meeting later this year. The Board has decided to move the meeting in Vienna to May 2021, hoping that the world has opened again by then.

However, we will need an AGM in 2020 for decision-making.

For the AGM 2020 there are three options:

- a. having a virtual AGM
- b. having a real AGM in Zwolle (Netherlands)
- c. a combination of a. and b.

At the moment there is far too much uncertainty to make a final decision. This will be done at the end of August and you will be informed by then.

2. AGM 2021 and Teachers' Conference 2021

We are planning to have our AGM 2021 in **Vienna** (probably **May20 &21, 2021**) and our Teachers' Conference 2021 in **Chelyabinsk** (probably **October 21 & 22, 2021**).

Please save the dates for 2021, but with a proviso. We will contact the institutes that were planning to organise an AGM or Conference in 2022 or later, because we might have to reshuffle the EJTA Conference Calendar.

3. News about the board

The EJTA Board had an online meeting on Thursday 14 May morning (see

proof underneath).

About the formation of the new Board (Nico Drok, Maria Lukina and Nadia Vissers step down) we can only repeat what we said in the previous Newsletter: Carien Touwen, Anne Leppäjärvi and Tiko Tsomaia are candidates to be elected at the next AGM.

To refresh your memory: Nadia will continue 'serving' EJTA in the function of Director from September 2020 onwards. She will be responsible for the organisation and coordination in close cooperation with the President and Board members. The tasks of the Secretariat will remain the same.
