### 2. #EJTAIk2



EJTA started with a new, social activity to bridge the current physical distance between EJTA members and to create a win-win for all members.

At regular intervals, we organise online brunch meetings about themes that are core issues in journalism teaching and with good practices to learn from each other.

These 'EJTAlks' are created to be both informal chats and informative meetings.

The first edition on 13 November 2020 with the theme 'Tips and tricks on teaching journalism in corona times' was an immediate success with more than 25 participants. This is very promising for the following editions to which all EJTA-members are most warmly invited:

### 3. Conferences 2021

We know everybody really hopes to have a live AGM and conference in Vienna in May 2021, but the option of a blended or online conference seems to be become more and more realistic now.

The Director and Board will keep you informed, but we need to ask you to be patient. As mentioned in the previous Newsletter of November 2020: no definite decision will be made before the next Board meeting in March 2021.

But you can be assured there WILL be EJTA conferences in 2021, in whatever form. The next EJTA AGMs and conferences (2022 and 2023) are planned to take place in Aarhus, Mechelen, Tbilisi and Liverpool, but not necessarily in this chronological order.

# 4. EJTA Strategy

We had to postpone our Strategy discussion to our next AGM, which will be in May 2021. The main question is simple: what do you expect from EJTA in the next 5 years? You're still very welcome to send your ideas and suggestions to <u>Nadia Vissers</u> before February 1st 2021.

### 5. EUfactcheck: state of affairs



In autumn 2020 EUfactcheck started its fourth publication season with new ideas, participants and initiatives such as cross-national collaboration between EJTA schools, new formats (media analysis) and a possibility for staff to publish tips and tricks on how to teach fact checking. We plan to continue with this collaborative project in spring 2021 (with new publications starting on 15 February 2021) and all EJTA members are welcome to join the start-up meeting of spring semester 2021 on Monday 18 January 2021, 4.30 pm CET.
