Teachers' Conference 2021 - 20-21 May 2021

Brigitte Alfter, director of Arena comments on the EJTA Teachers' Conference of 20-21 May 2021.

"The Arena team was very happy to cooperate with EJTA and to host the 2021 EJTA Teachers' Conference on how to teach data journalism in the framework of Dataharvest, the European Investigative Journalism Conference. This collaboration will help us to share the newest thinking and practice in the field of data, crossborder and investigative journalism with those who prepare the next generation of journalists.

The cooperation with the EJTA board and secretariat was smooth and flexible with quick and efficient communication and decision-making.

We were happy to see that more than 100 EJTA teachers from all over Europe joined the 2-day programme, that was integrated into the 2021 online Dataharvest conference.

A partnership between EJTA and Arena on data journalism seems very natural, as Arena has a large network in European and global data journalism and EJTA is bringing the next generation to this community. We hope to continue and expand the cooperation and hope that Arena can support the development, for example as a number of the participating schools now set out to build a data journalism task force within EJTA."

Data journalism teachers task force

#EJTAlk4 on increasing media diversity through journalism teaching

On **24 September at 12 am CET**, Anne Leppäjärvi coordinates the fourth online EJTAlk about increasing diversity in journalism and journalism teaching. Underneath her invitation to all:

"Starting from a project in Haaga-Helia, we wonder what could be our role as journalism schools to help immigrant journalists integrate and get employed in their new home countries. How can we find new ways to do journalism in a diverse, multilingual environment and how can we broaden the story choices and point of views in journalism?

Let's EJTAlk about how to increase media diversity through journalism teaching on 24th September! We will start with a couple of short introductions of EJTA schools in this field. One experiment will be the above mentioned Haaga-Helia's study programme for journalists who immigrated to Finland.

But of course we want to hear more from you and we are calling out to EJTA schools: do share your experiences with us.

If you wish to share or introduce a project with immigrant journalists, please contact Nadia Vissers and Anne Leppäjärvi before 10 September.

We would also love to hear about other projects that aim to increase diversity in the editorial rooms, journalism and journalism schools."
