Candidates will make themselves known before 25 October 2021 in an email to the EJTA President <u>Eric Nahon</u> and Director <u>Nadia Vissers</u>. They should provide a short biography with a photograph and their motivation (about 100-150 words).

Also President Eric Nahon has already been in function for two years and is quite willing to serve you all for two more years on the EJTA Board. That is why we suggest a re-election for him.

Of course, if members want to step up for the position of President in the Board, they are kindly invited to announce this and send a mail to Nadia Vissers and we will organise a vote according to our statues.

EUFACTCHECK

On 25 October we will start the sixth season at EUfactcheck.

The EJTA project is going strong and is generating a lot of traffic, even in 'low season' (summer holiday). Students and lecturers highly value the project as a good learning environment on fact-based journalism. Many schools have already incorporated fact-checking modules in their curriculum. Our Flowchart and Manual are regularly downloaded from the website by third parties, showing that we are also valued outside our own EJTA community.

A core group of schools participates regularly and thus enables a good flow of publications. New schools have joined, new ideas are on try-out (video fact checks), more cross-national collaboration happens and we all look forward to meeting up at the AGM in Mechelen. Prior to the conference we will organise a 'booster event' for everybody who is already a part of the EUfactcheck community or eager to join! As from September 2021 Carien Touwen has taken over the EUfactcheck project management from Nadia Vissers. If you would like to participate in our wonderful project you can contact Carien.

Finally: at the AGM dinner the Council of Europe Prize for Factchecking 2020-2021 will be rewarded to the school with the best fact check of the previous two seasons.
