How can we coach students better to find their own profile?

We teach our students knowledge, skills and methods they need to be good journalists. We show them state of the art media production, cool projects and inspiring role models. But how do they find out what kind of journalism suits them personally best that will make them happy?

In this EJTAlk we will look at a two-year long structured approach with practical tools developed by MAZ – the Swiss School of Journalism. And we will get to know an initiative of the 14 French schools of Journalism to tackle this question. If you want to contribute to the discussion after the two presentations, think about your approach and tell us how you show your students how to find out what really suits them in the profession.

### TEACHERS' CONFERENCE AARHUS: IMPORTANT CALL

The colleagues of DMJX are already very actively preparing the programme and logistical support and because we always want to engage our own EJTA members in our Teachers' Conference we have three important questions for you:

## 1. Will you host a workshop?

We seek university (college) or mid-career members that have practical teaching experiences with or have done academic research on engagement journalism, who will share their knowledge and best practices in a 30 minute breakout session (15 min. best practice / 15 min. Q&A). We are open to any suggestions, so please let us know if you or a colleague you know of, match this description.

# 2. Will you participate in a panel debate on journalism schools' role in depolarisation?

Do journalism schools have a responsibility to tackle polarisation? If so – is teaching constructive and engagement journalism the answer? These are the questions we would love to debate with fellow EJTA members in a panel discussion, so if you have an opinion on this, please tell us.
