3. Teachers' conference: Dublin, Friday 24 and Saturday 25 October 2014

The Dublin Institute of Technology will organize the first EJTA Autumn Conference. It is specifically aimed at teachers and students from EJTA members and practitioners from Irish J-schools. Theme is: *From speed journalism to slow journalism*. This will include subjects such as long-form story-telling, investigative journalism and data journalism in journalism education and training. The Conference will focus on best practice sessions, but there will also be time slots for paper presentations, panel discussions and expert lectures.

Submission details for paper sessions: paper titles or panel suggestions with a brief description (100 to 150 words)

The conference team will welcome submissions for papers or panel discussions and proposals for workshops on:

- Data journalism and journalism education, investigative journalism, long-form journalism.
- Case-studies involving experiences in journalism training on any of the above themes or collaborative projects with industry or community partners which included these themes.
- Models of good practice in journalism teaching, related to any of the above themes will be welcome in the form of papers, panels or workshops.

You will be told if you are successful in your submission by the end of August.

Registration for the conference will open from the beginning of September.

There will be room for about 100 participants.
