The Board had a meeting in Milan on November 4th and discussed amongst other things membership and possible new members, relationship and meeting with the FEJS board, the organisation of the AGM and Conference 2016 and 2017, EJTA projects and research, the secretariat and the new communication tools.

But the most important item on the agenda was the evaluation of and necessary changes to the EJTA Statutes that are quite out-dated.

We want to officially announce that a change of the Statutes is on the agenda at the next AGM in Tbilisi, so make sure that you're present.

# 3. Conference and AGM Tbilisi: 16 & 17 June 2016

The 2016 Conference and AGM will be organised by the colleagues from the Georgian

Insitute of Public Affairs in Tbilisi.

The exact date has been set (after a mini referendum) on Thursday 16 June (Conference) and Friday 17 June (AGM) 2016. At the AGM we'll talk about the project 'Faktabaari' (cf. underneath, item 6) and a new research project of EJTA (cf. item 8). Moreover we hope to be welcoming a rather large group of new members and we'll discuss an important change of our statutes.

The exact theme of the Conference is still under construction but will certainly be related to 'reliability, credibility and deception in the media'.



# 4. WJEC4

As you probably all know the 4th World Journalism Education Congress will be held at Auckland University of Technology, New Zealand, from 14 until 16 July 2016.

Following the successful third edition in Mechelen – of which EJTA was co-organiser – Auckland is the next host.

The general theme of the congress is 'Identity and Integrity of Journalism Education' inspired by the contemporary shifts in the place of journalism programmes within the university



environment and in relationships with industry ad society.

During the FEJS conference in Porto on October 7th the FEJS and EJTA Board had a meeting about how to consolidate the continuity in their cooperation. Apart from exchanging and contacting each other's members, we also agreed on being active on each other's conferences and websites and on cooperating within future projects such as Faktabaari.

FEJS is working hard on their professionalization and on 10/10/15 there were elections, with the following outcome: new members are Severin Rosenberger from Austria, Hanna Karlson from Finland and Iris Hendriks from The Netherlands. Romana Biljak from Slovenia and Marnix Van Roosbroek from Belgium continue being Board members.

# **FAKTABAARI**

This crowdsourced fact-checking project was introduced to us by Anna Leppäjärvi during the EJTA conference in Brussels May 2015. The project intends to gather journalism students from EJTA- and FEJS-schools to organise a journalistic fact-checking service for citizens, using social media to answer questions by citizens about political statements during elections. The project wants to start with pilots in national or regional elections and hopes to reach its peak in a European fact-checking network during EU parliamentary elections in 2019.

During the conference in Tbilisi we'll organise a workshop to discuss the concept and methodology.

"#ChangeEU - A call for collaboration:
multimedia storytelling describing change in
different European countries
During the current academic year, at Walter
Tobagi Graduate School of Journalism (@
University of Milan) we're developing a series
of 15 multimedia webdocs made by our 30
students. The topic is common and very broad:
change. Change seen in social issues, sports,
science, popular culture and so on. The format
will be multimedia storytelling: narrative
projects made by text + video + audio/slideshow
+ photographs + charts/timelines (of course not
always all of them). The lenght will be around
15/20 minutes of experience. The platform we're

We've now decided to open up the project and ask other schools of other European countries to contribute with their own webdocs. Every school could bring - let's say between 5 and 15 webdocs. It will be very easy to integrate them in the same collection in Medium. If so, each school should provide for every work a version in the original language and one translated in English (which means with subtitles, for videos).

Deadline: within April 30th 2016 (we're publishing our first 5 webdocs in January). We're now accepting responses to our call, until December 10th. Please send them (or ask for further information) to stefano.rizzato85@gmail.com."
