As a European organisation, it is essential for us to maintain a nuanced understanding of the diverse forces of disinformation influencing public opinion and policies, with a specific focus on the role of media and journalism education in countering these challenges.

#EJTAlk13 will highlight the severe challenges faced by European countries, where political conditions, exacerbated by external disinformation campaigns, present significant obstacles to media freedom. Georgia, on the brink of its parliamentary elections, serves as a critical case study.

#EJTALK14: 13 December 2024, 12 am CET

Topic: 'Engaging Gen Z: Experimenting with News for a Challenging Audience'.

During #EJTAlk14 Dr. Tena Perišin and Dr. Petra Kovačević from the University of Zagreb will present their groundbreaking experimental research into the preferences of Generation Z, with a particular focus on visual and video journalism. In their experiment, they created different versions of video stories about climate change, exploring various textual and visual narratives to discover what resonates most with this highly demanding and complex audience. Learn about their findings and participate in a discussion on what

more can be done to build trust between the media and Gen Z audiences. Invitation and link follow later.

EUROPEAN AGORA FOR JOURNALISM: CALL TO PARTICIPATE

The 2nd edition of the **European Agora for Journalism** will take place in Brussels on 20-22 November. It has the ambition to become a major biannual meeting where media professionals & journalists will be able to discuss the challenges of their professions with the public, researchers, political and economic experts, and civil society representatives. It is free. This 2nd edition will focus on the use of AI in European newsrooms and the impact of its development on journalism education.

There is an opportunity for EJTA members to host a 90-minute session on best practices on teaching AI in journalism schools in Europe nowadays on Friday 22 November, 11 am- 12:30 pm . The public will be journalists, journalism students, media researchers & journalism teachers.

This session will be mainly coordinated with the organizers (the <u>French NGO Journalisme & Citoyenneté</u> - J&C- and the <u>Journalism School of the Ihecs</u>).
