Includes 2 assignments + a 3-day study trip to Brussels / learning diary

The trip includes visits in major EU institutions and specialized presentations from experts: MEP and assistants, EU commission experts, Finnish government, lobbying organizations, correspondent

Visit to the House of Europe (EU Parliament museum)

Comments from the students

- opens the connection between the EU and national legislation
- Strengthens the idea of European community as a peace and democracy project
- Gives boost to those who have been interested in global reporting and also those not so impressed by the importance of EU
- serves as an important step towards political journalism

Common challenge: missing the broader understanding of history
